Designation:

A wine produced from two grape varieties of the Peloponnese - the southern mainland of Greece.

Harvest & Winemaking:

Both Moscofilero and Rhoditis varieties flourish in the vineyards at a height of around 2000ft, and this in combination with low summer temperatures promotes the slow ripening of the grapes which gives a finesse to the wine.

Characteristics:

It possesses a delicate, somewhat flowery bouquet with a refined, lively and fruity character.

Pairings:

Perfect with a wide variety of dishes: fish, seafood, white meats, appetizers, salads. Serve chilled.

Designation:

It originates from the region of Nemea in the southern mainland of Greece - the Peloponnese.

Characteristics:

It possesses a characteristic ruby color, rich aroma, and develops a pleasant roundness and fruitiness on the palate.
